im is admired for his years of hard work, unwavering values and his dedication to helping others—even when the odds are stacked against them. It's that same dedication that he shows his wife of 29 years, Delores "Moe" Bainey, his family, his fleet, T.L. Bainey Inc., a competitive race team—DRT Enterprises—and all the friendships he's gained along the way. Indeed, Tim has made a profound impact on all who know him—and even on many who don't.

"It all started in high school in my wrestling days," Tim says. "I learned how hard you really have to work in order to win. Most people have no idea how hard it is, or are unwilling to make the sacrifices necessary to really succeed. An old mentor of mine used to tell me all the time: 'the funny thing about luck is, the harder you work, the luckier you get."

Tim started out in trucking in 1988 as a company driver, pulling a dump trailer. He recounts: "Soon after that, my father-in-law decided to get out of the trucking business, so I borrowed some money, bought the truck from him and started driving for myself. Fortunately, I was able to partner up with a couple of reputable carriers as soon as possible."

Since then, Tim's been an owneroperator, a racecar driver and now is an active fleet owner and racing team owner. Tim's fleet, T.L. Bainey Inc., typically hauls freight from distribution centers to retailers. His racing team is named DRT Enterprises (drtenterprises.com) for his three sons, Dan, Randy and Tim Jr. Dan is Crew Chief, Randy is Manager of Operations and Tim Jr. is in the driver's seat. "My son Tim Jr. is sponsored by Greased Lightning and races in the USAR Hooters Pro Cup Series (usarprocup.com)," Tim says, beaming. "It's an incredibly competitive series, and I'm proud of how my boys are rising to the challenge this year."

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Today, Tim's fleet consists of eight company trucks and four owneroperators, in addition to his indispensible administrative assistants, Moe and Kim. Tim says, "Sometimes we have more trucks and drivers than we have work, but that's how the trucking industry goes, you have to be flexible and adaptable." But that doesn't mean Tim doesn't value his drivers; in fact, quite the opposite. "My drivers are not numbers - they're people. And putting them in the right equipment is one of the ways I keep drivers happy and productive — we've made a lot of gains in this area because of help from SelecTrucks."


How does Tim find drivers? "Getting drivers isn't too hard—getting good drivers is. You're only as good as the people you have around you." Tim credits

his strong network of relationships for bringing him key drivers.

Tim feels a key to success lies in giving drivers full responsibility and trusting them to do the right thing. "Trucking is a 24-hour-a-day job. I tell my drivers 'if you have to call me at 2:00 a.m., please call me. Just please don't tell me you only need a windshield wiper," Tim says, laughing. His drivers also know they can rely on him to keep them on the road with quality equipment and professional service.

The fact is evident when it comes to maintenance and repairs for Tim's fleet. He explains, "No matter where we are, out on the road, I always try to get my trucks to a Freightliner location for service — because I know we'll get quality service. It doesn't matter if I break down

in Boston or in Las Vegas, there's someone nearby that's going to go the extra mile for you," Tim says. "And no matter where you go, they have the repair history available. Most of all, they have good people who are paid to fix trucks, not just tinker with them." Tim's latest truck purchase is a preowned, 2000 Century Class SleeperCab™ with a Detroit motor, which he purchased from SelecTrucks of Cleveland. He recounts: "We were on our way to a race, and I just happened to stop in to ask about a truck I needed for a guy I was getting ready to hire. That led to me getting exactly the truck I needed," Tim explains. "They put on new tires, gave me warranty options and all-around great service. I guess that's why SelecTrucks is different."

"Chuck's foundation (Navasky Foundation for Life) holds a number of benefit concerts for the One Less Tear music project (onelesstear.com), and his family business (falconesuits.com) has me hauling Chuck's inventory of custom suits to places like Vegas,


